- Apply strategies to implement culturally appropriate work practices.

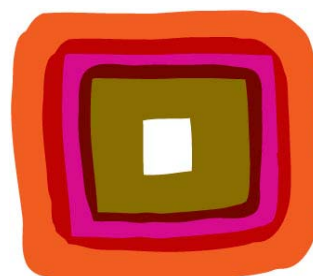
