Our Training Series offers a number of streams to increase the skills and knowledge of professionals, volunteers and community members who work and interact with refugee survivors of torture and trauma. All sessions are interactive and combine PowerPoint presentations and written and video case studies with large and small group discussions. Time is allowed for participants' reflection and planning.

Our trainers are experienced social workers, psychologists, teachers and community development practitioners currently working with clients and communities. This enables trainers to draw on current issues and themes to complement the training experience for participants.

Learning Pathways

Selecting the right Training Series

These two courses are designed for people doing different kinds of work.

The **Course for 'Incidental' Counsellors** is for when basic counselling is part of the work role but not the primary activity. Those in refugee settlement, youth work, housing, employment, welfare, health, community services or education roles will benefit from this course.

The **Course for Counsellors** is for workers whose primary role is counselling, and who have had extensive training and education in counselling. Their work often involves engaging with clients in a sustained counselling process over weeks and months and sometimes years.

The Refugee Experience

The first course in both training series is 'The Refugee Experience' which is offered in Dandenong and Brunswick. This one-day course provides an overview of the refugee experience using the Foundation House framework for understanding the psychosocial impact of torture and trauma. This module is designed for both new and experienced workers and introduces some key frameworks that are the basis for further training modules with Foundation House.

Content includes:

- Australia's humanitarian program and recent refugee settlement patterns in Victoria
- the traumatic experiences of refugees
- the impact on individuals, families and communities
- how to identify possible survivors of torture and trauma
- relevant services for refugee survivors and referral processes
- the Foundation House framework about the impact of torture and trauma which forms the basis for interventions
- the range of psychosocial effects of traumatic experiences
- strategies to achieve recovery goals

Course for Incidental Counsellors

This two-day course provides an approach for working with refugee survivors of torture and trauma in a range of settings. Participants will gain skills and strategies for building relationships with refugee clients, and for handling difficult and distressing situations.

Content includes:

- the principles of a good working relationship with traumatised clients
- cross-cultural considerations
- basic counselling skills to enhance responsiveness to refugee clients and families
- the emotional responses of workers and implications for practice
- the limits of your work with refugees and when and how to refer to relevant services

Spirituality and Human Service Practice

God centeredness is a core value of many of the people with whom Foundation House works. World views that give primacy to spiritual beliefs provide an important context for our therapeutic work. Spirituality is often inextricably linked to healing and recovery. The relationship between spirituality and human service practice is thus clearly important.

The purpose of this two day course is to affirm the importance of spiritually sensitive human service practice and to provide a space and a place for human service practitioners to intentionally and reflectively engage with spirituality and practice. Both the process and content of the sessions will be shaped by participants' preferences, but will involve case discussion, critical reflection on practice and gentle and respectful exploration of diverse spiritualities, theologies and world views. Our reflections and discussions will be of particular relevance to human service practitioners working with refugees but will also have a broader applicability and will be enhanced by exposure to selected readings. It is anticipated that these sessions will be in nature part supervision, part professional development and part training

The two days are five weeks apart and reflection tasks will be set for participants to encourage continued learning. A maximum of twelve participants will be offered a place. Given the privileging of reflection and conversation it is expected that participants attend both sessions.

School's In for Refugees

This is a comprehensive introductory training that is recommended as the first training from Foundation House for those working with refugee background students. This training is appropriate for those working in schools and other educational settings, at primary, secondary and post compulsory levels.

The training covers:

- the refugee experience for young people including their prior education experiences
- the impact of trauma on young people's learning and wellbeing
- strategies that support the recovery process that teachers and other staff can use in the classroom
- a whole school approach and key areas where schools can increase support for refugee background students.

Participants will receive a copy of *School's In for Refugees, a Whole School Guide to Refugee Readiness*, a resource that assists schools in understanding refugee background issues and guides the implementation of a whole school approach to support. Participants will be introduced to other Foundation House resources for small group and classroom programs and activities.

Refugee Health: Training for Nurses

The Refugee Health Nurse training is a two year program, divided into themed modules. The program aims to provide an overview of the key areas of refugee health and wellbeing relevant to Refugee Health Nurses and other nurses who are working with people of a refugee background.

The two day introductory course, it will provide an overview of refugee health and wellbeing to inform community based practice. Subsequent sessions over 2010 will be open to all nurses working in refugee health who have undertaken introductory sessions in 2010 or previously.

It is an exciting time to be working in refugee health as the sector develops and there are new developments in a range of clinical and social health areas, relevant to nursing practice. The training days will provide an overview of emerging research, policy and service development in refugee health as well as the opportunity to share valuable practice experience.
